A child may be missing for many reasons:

Children can easily get lost in busy places such as shopping centres, fairgrounds, theme parks, airports, and busy streets.

They may runaway after an argument or family dispute, have problems at school, bullying etc. Life as a runaway can be devastating as they are extremely vulnerable and can easily mix with the wrong crowd and become the victim of abuse, involved in drugs, crime or prostitution.

Or they may have been abducted.

Whilst on holiday in foreign countries children are particularly vulnerable if they get lost, runaway or are abducted.

With your child's identity information stored securely on a Rescue me cd™ you can immediately provide the police with everything they need, wherever you are in the world. The speed to do so could significantly reduce the time to find them and the likelihood of harm coming to them.

Children can also go missing when; at nursery, school, boarding school, a youth organisation, or when they are in the care of a childminder or relative etc. Ultimately they have the responsibility of care for your child, yet they hold little, if any ID information. Should your child go missing, they must contact you for more details to pass on to local police, which wastes precious time. The Rescue me cd Family ID Kit™ contains 4 credit card CD's in total, so hand one to them that contains only your child's details. Greatly enhancing their capability to assist the police in getting your child found safely and quickly, wherever they are!

The fingerprint, DNA and dental impression records captured from the Rescue me cd Family ID Kit™ will greatly assist the authorities in tracing your child, or if an unidentifiable body is found they are able to use this information to determine if there is a match.
